Professional writing students display their work at The Print Futures 2001 Portfolio Show

The professional writing program at Douglas College presents ***The Print Futures 2001 Portfolio Show***, on Friday, April 6, from 4 to 8 p.m. The Portfolio Show is an opportunity for graduating students to display their talents in writing and document design.

"The Portfolio Show showcases the graduating class," says Dean Lorna McCallum. "As writers, they will present examples of their work to potential employers and clients using the portfolio. This Show is their first step of their professional lives."

Students demonstrate the knowledge and skills they've gained to produce documents in many areas of professional writing. The Portfolio Show displays student work in technical communication, public relations, writing for the web, magazine writing, and research reporting.

Print Futures accepts twenty-five students each year into the full-time two-year program. Students take 18 six-credit courses, and participate in a work practicum between the two years. Courses are taught by working professionals who are experts in their fields. Print Futures graduates pursue writing careers from corporate communication to technical writing to freelance writing and editing services.

The ***Print Futures 2001 Portfolio Show*** will be held on Friday, April 6th, from 4 to 8 p.m. in the Amelia Douglas Gallery. The Gallery is located at Douglas College's New Westminster Campus, 700 Royal Avenue.
